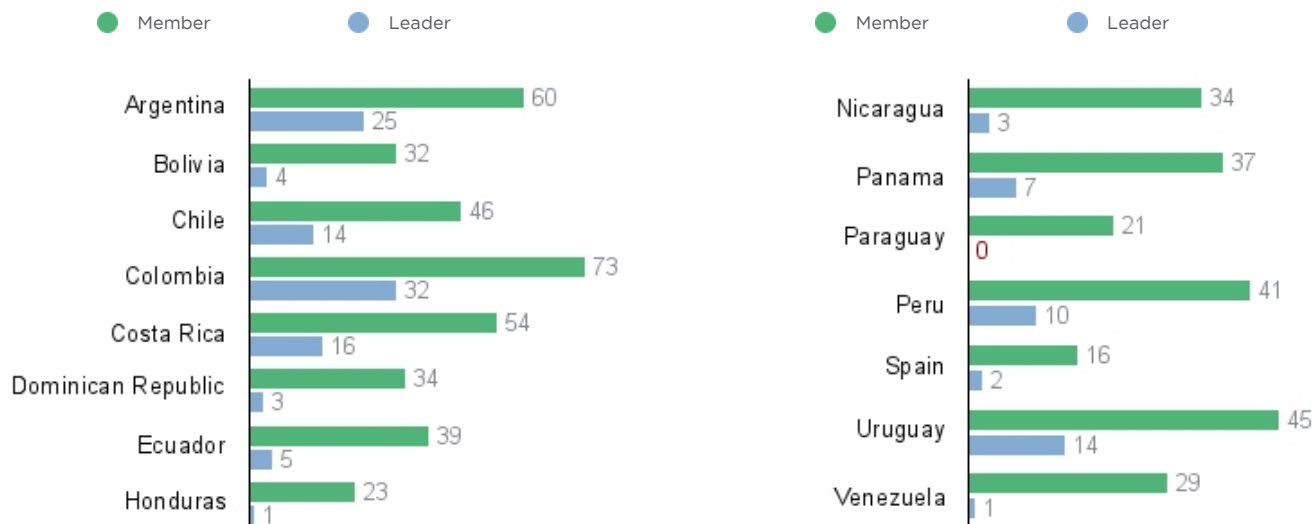


## PARTICIPATION AND ROLE IN CONSORTIUMS SINCE 1998



## MEMBER COUNTRIES



Argentina is one of the founding members of FONTAGRO in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 20 million. During the 23 membership years, Argentina has participated in 60 consortiums that represent approximately US\$ 52.4 million, of which US\$ 14.7 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Argentina has led 25 of these consortiums for US\$ 22.0 million. The projects in which Argentina has participated have included research and technological development in potatoes, corn, rice, fruit trees, alfalfa, wheat, management of natural resources, livestock, adaptation to climate change, among others.



Bolivia has been a member of FONTAGRO since 2000 with a contribution of US\$ 2.5 million. During 21 years of membership, Bolivia has participated in 32 consortiums with a total of US\$ 25.1 million of which US\$ 9.6 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Bolivian institutions have led 4 consortiums for US\$ 2.2 million. The projects have covered research and technological development in potatoes, corn, beans, organic agriculture, adaptation to climate change, among others.



Chile has been part of FONTAGRO since its foundation in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 2.5 million. During the 23 years of membership, Chile has led 14 consortiums for a total of US\$ 13.0 million and participated in 46 consortiums with US\$ 38.4 million, of which US\$ 12.1 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. The projects have included research and technological development of wheat, potatoes, fruit trees, aquaculture, fodder, livestock, sustainable use of natural resources, among others.



Colombia has been part of FONTAGRO since its foundation in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 10 million. During the 23 years of membership, Colombian institutions have participated in 73 consortiums for a total amount of US\$ 59.9 million, of which US\$ 20.2 were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Colombian institutions have led 32 consortiums for an amount of US\$ 22.4 million. Additionally, international organizations based or operating in the country (CIAT, CIMMYT, IFPRI and IICA) have led 12 consortiums. The projects have included research and technological development for livestock, corn, coffee, potatoes, plantains, fruit trees, oil palm, fodder, livestock, among others.



Costa Rica has been part of FONTAGRO since its foundation in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 0.68 million. During the 23 years of membership, Costa Rica has participated in 54 consortiums for a total amount of US \$ 46.7 million; of which US\$ 14.7 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other donors . Costa Rica has led 16 consortiums with US\$ 13.2 million. The projects have included research and technological development for livestock, rice, wheat, potatoes, citrus, fruit, fodder, risk management, use of water, adaptation to climate change, among others.



Dominican Republic is one of the founding countries of FONTAGRO in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 2.5 million. During the 23 years of membership, the Dominican Republic has participated in 34 consortiums representing US\$ 32.3 million, of which US\$ 9.7 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. The Dominican Republic has led 3 of these consortiums with US\$ 1.8 million. The projects in which the Dominican Republic has participated have included research and technological development for coffee, corn, honey, bananas, beans, avocados, bananas and livestock, and other important issues for agricultural development, such as climate change.



Ecuador is one of the founding countries of FONTAGRO in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 2.5 million. During the 23 years of membership, Ecuador has participated in 39 consortiums that represent a total of US\$ 34.1 million, of which US\$ 10.4 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. INIAP of Ecuador has led 5 consortiums with US\$ 5.8 million. The projects in which Ecuador has participated have included research and technological development for potatoes, corn, rice, fruit, beans, livestock, climate change, among others.



Honduras has been member of FONTAGRO since 2005 with a contribution of US\$ 2.5 million, and has participated in 23 consortiums for US\$ 16.7 million, of which US\$ 6.9 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Honduras has led 1 consortium for US\$ 0.4 million. The projects in which Honduras have participated have included research and development for the cultivation of coffee, corn, beans, potatoes, livestock, among others.



Nicaragua has been member of FONTAGRO since its creation in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 1.0 million. During the 23 years of membership, Nicaragua has participated in 34 consortiums representing a total of US\$ 27.6 million, of which US \$ 10.3 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Additionally, Nicaragua has led 3 of these 34 consortiums. The projects in which Nicaragua has participated have included research and technological development in coffee, corn, bean, banana, rice, cassava, tomato and palm crops. Nicaragua has also participated in livestock projects, production chains, food safety, rural extension, among others.



Panama has been member of FONTAGRO since its creation in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 5.0 million. During the 23 years of membership, Panama has participated in consortia 37 times, for a total amount of US\$ 31.2 million, of which US\$ 10.7 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Panama has led 7 consortiums with US\$ 5.7 million. The projects have included research and technological development on climate change, rice, potatoes, corn, beans, coffee, bananas and livestock, among others.



Paraguay is one of the founding countries of FONTAGRO in 1998, with a contribution of US\$ 2.0 million. During the 23 years of membership, Paraguay has participated in 21 consortia for a total amount of US\$ 18.3 million, of which US\$ 5.4 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. The projects have included research and technological development on wheat, cassava, organic production, information and monitoring systems for risk management in agricultural production, strategies for climate change, among others.



Peru became a member of FONTAGRO in 2000 with a contribution of US\$ 2.5 million. During the 21 years of membership, Peru has participated in 41 consortiums for a total amount of US\$ 34.6 million, of which US\$ 12.8 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Peru has led 10 consortiums for US\$ 6.3 million. The projects in which Peru has participated included research and technological development on adaptation to climate change, potatoes, sweet potatoes, corn, beans, amazonian fruit trees, Solanaceae, among others.



Spain became a member of FONTAGRO in 2008 with a contribution of US\$ 14.72 million. During 13 years of membership, Spain has participated in 16 consortiums for US\$ 12.3 million, of which US\$ 4.1 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Spain has led 2 consortiums for US\$ 2.4 million. The projects in which Spain has participated have included research and technological development for potatoes, corn, fruit trees, Solanaceae and adaptation to climate change.



Uruguay has been part of FONTAGRO since its creation in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 2.5 million. During the 23 years of membership, Uruguay has led 14 consortiums for US \$ 12.5 million and participated in 45 consortiums for US\$ 40.6 million, of which US\$ 12.2 million were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. The projects have included research and technological development for livestock, rice, wheat, potatoes, barley, citrus, apple, fodder, risk management, water use efficiency, organic production, among others.



Venezuela is one of the founding countries of FONTAGRO in 1998 with a contribution of US\$ 12.0 million. During the 23 years of membership, Venezuela has participated in 29 consortiums that represent a total of US\$ 23.9 million, of which US\$ 7.6 millions were contributed by FONTAGRO and other agencies. Venezuela has led 1 consortium for US\$ 2.2 million. The projects in which Venezuela has participated have included research and technological development in potatoes, rice, bananas, corn, beans, fruit trees, aquaculture, among others.
